At Specialty Coffee Expo, Fairtrade Convenes *Empty Cups* - A Panel Event on Climate Change and the Future of Coffee

BOSTON, United States – What do the economics of climate change look like for coffee farmers? How are coffee producers mitigating and adapting to the impacts of climate change? And what are climate change's long-term implications for the coffee industry as a whole?

On 8 April, Fairtrade and leading stakeholders will tackle these questions in **Empty Cups** – an inperson panel event addressing the impact of climate change and the future of coffee to be held at the Specialty Coffee Expo in Boston, US. The panel discussion comes amid Fairtrade's introduction of a new Living Income Reference Price for coffee sourced in Indonesia's Aceh region as part of the organization's ongoing global effort to protect farmers from market volatility and empower them in achieving decent and sustainable livelihoods.

Moderated by Fairtrade America's **Kate Stritzinger**, **Empty Cups** will explore the nexus of climate change and social justice in the world's coffee industry and what consumers, industry, and legislators can do to affect meaningful and lasting change.
